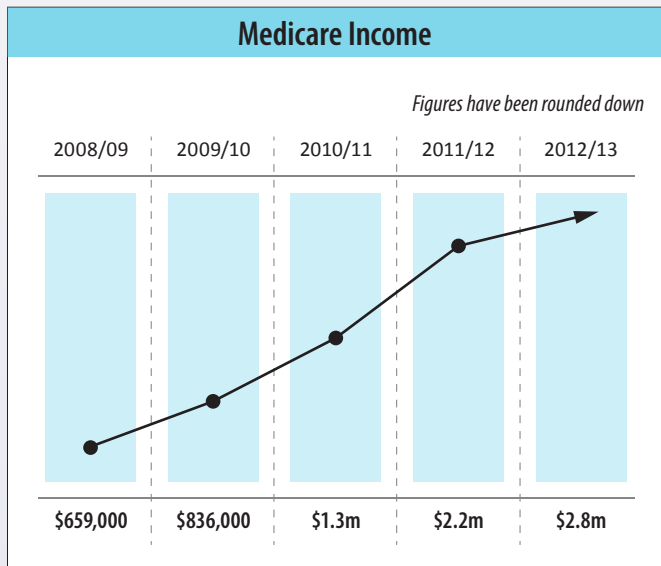
Clinical Services

We continue to employ staff with the necessary skills and experience to provide a professional service to the community. This includes maintaining our commitment of providing employment opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.



K. Other Improvements

- ✓ Shift to paperless clinics with over 500,000 documents scanned.
- ✓ Stage 1 Continuous Quality Improvement (ISO9001:2008) achieved and well progressed to Stage 2 assessment.
- ✓ Multiple community events held to celebrate ATSICHS 40 years, including an afternoon tea held on 14 May 2013 to recognise the official commencement date of ATSICHS back in 1973.
- ✓ Establishment of the Aunty Pamela Mam Indigenous Nursing Scholarship with Griffith University.
- ✓ Upgrades to the Northgate and Acacia Ridge clinics have been completed.
- ✓ Jimbelunga Nursing Centre master plan completed and future funding of \$12.5m to implement the plan has been approved by the Commonwealth Department of Health and Ageing (DOHA).
- ✓ IFACSS successful in securing Family Intervention Service funding from the Queensland Department of Communities.
- ✓ ATSICHS is the first AMS to achieve a low rating against all 41 criteria as part of the DOHA biannual risk assessment audit.
