

Bowel cancer is the second deadliest cancer affecting 1 in 14 Australians.

It is treatable and beatable when detected early, highlighting the importance of screening.

Regular testing is critical because there may be no symptoms during the early stages of bowel cancer. Start testing from age 45 and screen every two years.

Screening is a simple process and can be done in the comfort of your own home with a free take home kit. Ask to speak with a health worker at any of our clinics or collect a take home kit at reception.

ABOUT THE TEST KIT

The screening kit tests for signs of bowel cancer by looking for non-visible blood in poo.

It involves taking samples from two bowel motions within the comfort of your own home. These samples are then posted to a pathology lab for analysis and if blood is detected, further tests may be required.

SYMPTOMS OF BOWEL CANCER MAY INCLUDE:

- A change in bowel habit such as diarrhoea, constipation or the feeling or incomplete emptying
- A change in the shape or appearance of your poo
- Blood in your poo
- Abdominal pain or swelling
- Pain or a lump
- Weight loss
- Unexplained fatigue or anaemia causing tiredness and weakness





THE FACTS

Cervical cancer is one of the most preventable cancers.

It's recommended to start screening at age 25 and complete a cervical cancer screening test every five years.

The screening test looks for the presence of the human papillomavirus (HPV). An HPV infection that doesn't clear up can cause changes in the cells of the cervix and may eventually lead to cervical cancer.

It's important to complete the screening test every five years even if you are vaccinated against HPV, are not sexually active or have only ever been with one sexual partner.

You can make an appointment to have the cervical screening test completed by a doctor or nurse at any of our clinics, or if preferred, you can choose the self-collection option.

Ask to speak with a health worker at any of our clinics or collect a take home kit at reception.



ABOUT THE SELF-COLLECTION OPTION

The self-collection option allows you to take a sample yourself at home with a kit that includes a long cotton swab and instructions.

Once you have collected the sample, you can drop it at any pathology collection centre for analysis.

Your doctor will then discuss the results with you at your next appointment.
